Judge Peter Boshier is Chief Ombudsman for New Zealand.

He was appointed as the Principal Family Court Judge of New Zealand and held that position until December 2012 when he was appointed a Law Commissioner, a position he held until being appointed as Chief Ombudsman.

Judge Boshier has served on the Government's Family Violence Taskforce. He is Patron of the White Ribbon Trust and Patron of the Dwell Community Housing Trust in Wellington.

In July 2015, Judge Boshier became the President of the Association of Family and Conciliation Courts based in the United States. He is the first New Zealander to hold this position and does so until July 2016.
