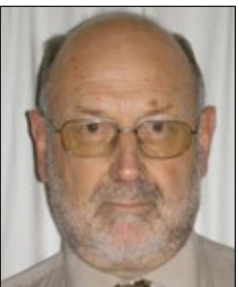
Theresa Donnelly, Ministry of Social Development, Auckland
