

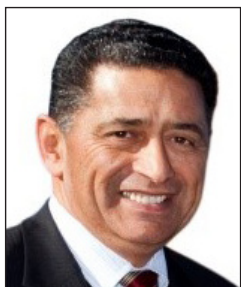
## CHAIR



### **Matanuku Mahuika, Kahui Legal, Wellington**

Matanuku (Ngati Porou, Ngati Raukawa) is a lawyer and has been in corporate and private practice since 1991. He is a founding partner of the law firm Kahui Legal and provides advice on a wide range of corporate, commercial, Treaty settlement, Māori land and public law issues. Matanuku has acted on a large number of Treaty of Waitangi settlements, has advised Ngati Porou on foreshore and seabed issues, and in 2012 was the Chair of the Ministerial Panel on the reform of Te Ture Whenau Māori Act 1993. Matanuku has held a wide variety of board roles. These include being the former Chair of Sealord Group Limited and current Chair of the Ngati Porou Holding Company, which oversees Ngati Porou's commercial interests.

### **The Honourable Justice Joseph Williams, Court of Appeal, Wellington**

Justice Williams is of Ngāti Pukenga, Waitaha and Tapuika descent. He was appointed Chief Judge of the Māori Land Court in 1999, Chair of the Waitangi Tribunal in 2004, a Judge of the High Court in 2008, and a Judge of the Court of Appeal in February 2018.



### **Kiwa Whatarau, NZ Trade and Enterprise, Auckland**

Kiwa (Ngāti Kahungunu, Ngāti Raukawa-ki-te-Tonga and Ngāti Tamaterā) is an Investment Manager at NZTE. In his role Kiwa assists Māori companies raise capital for international growth, works with Māori investors to identify suitable investment opportunities, and supports the establishment of greenfield projects that mobilise Māori-owned assets and capital.
