The Hon Justice Terence Arnold, Wellington

Terence Arnold was appointed a judge of the High Court and Court of Appeal in May 2006. Justice Arnold was Solicitor General from 2000 until his appointment to the bench. As Solicitor General he was also chair of the Ministerial Advisory Group which provided recommendations to the then Attorney General on the purpose, structure, composition and role of the new Supreme Court. Prior to his appointment as Solicitor-General he was a partner of Chapman Tripp Sheffield Young 1985 - 1994. He became a barrister sole in 1994 and was appointed Queen's Counsel in 1997. Before joining Chapman Tripp Justice Arnold taught at Victoria University in Wellington as well as at several Canadian universities. He has taught, written and presented seminars in a variety of areas and has been active in the development of skills based training for lawyers.

David Goddard QC, Wellington

David is a Queen's Counsel based in Wellington. He has a wide ranging commercial litigation practice, with an emphasis on competition law and market regulation, company law, contract law and the law of obligations, public law and international law. He also has a substantial involvement in law reform in New Zealand and overseas. David publishes and speaks regularly in his areas of specialisation, and has taught at universities in New Zealand, Australia and England. He is the Council of Legal Education moderator for contract law. David has practised as a barrister sole since 1999, and was appointed Queen's Counsel in 2003. Before that, he was a partner in the firm Chapman Tripp Sheffield Young from 1992 – 1998.

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
