The Hon Justice Mathew Downs, High Court, Auckland

Justice Downs graduated with an LLB (Hons) from Otago University in 1993, an LLM (Hons) from Cambridge University in 2001 and a Doctorate in Law from Otago University in 2011. He was appointed to the High Court in August 2016 and sits in Auckland. Prior to his appointment, Justice Downs was Senior Crown Counsel at Crown Law and one of New Zealand's most experienced appellate advocates. He is the editor-in-chief of *Cross on Evidence*, and a co-author of its next edition.



The Hon Justice Mark O'Regan, Supreme Court, Wellington

Justice Mark O'Regan is a Judge of the Supreme Court of New Zealand, appointed in 2014. He holds a BA and LLM (Victoria University) and was admitted to the Bar in 1977. He was a partner at Chapman Tripp from 1984 to 2000. He became a Judge of the High Court of New Zealand in 2001 and was appointed to the Court of Appeal in 2004, becoming its President in 2010.
