David was previously responsible for civil law and extradition in the UK Attorney General's Office, immigration and anti-terrorism law in the Home Office and implementing part of the Good Friday Peace Accord in the Northern Ireland Office. He has worked for the European Commission drafting and enforcing European Union-wide environment legislation. In 2011-2013 David was seconded back to the UK Cabinet Office and Treasury solicitor's Department to lead teams delivering constitutional law reform, commercial and procurement law reform and legal advice and legislative drafting in relation to national security while also assisting with the delivery of the shared legal services model adopted by the UK government.
