Professor John Burrows, School of Law, University of Canterbury

Professor Burrows has been a professor of law at the University of Canterbury since 1974. He was Dean of the Faculty from 1980 to 1986, and Deputy Vice-Chancellor of the university from 1999 - 2000.

His main interests are media law, statute law and the law of contract. He has written or co-written *Media Law in New Zealand*, *Statute Law in New Zealand* and *Law of Contract in New Zealand*. He also contributes to Lexis Nexis *Commercial Law* and Todd's *The Law of Torts in New Zealand*.

This will be the fourth *Update on Contract* seminar Professor Burrows has presented for the NZLS. The others were in 1985, 1991 and 1999. He also presented, for the NZLS, *Statutory Interpretation* with John Fogarty QC in 2001, and *Media Law* with Bill Wilson QC in 2003.
