

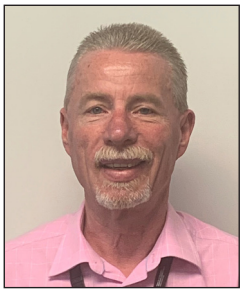

Kimberly provides strategic advice to clients dealing with difficult trust and estate problems, and acts in relation to trust and estate litigation of all kinds.



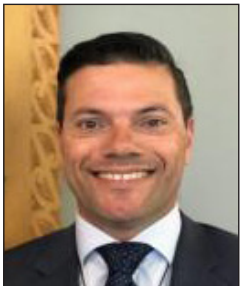
Kevin Lenahan, Greg Kelly Law, Wellington
